The new funding for grass pitches is coming from the Football Foundation.

## THE STATE OF GRASS PITCHES

## **GRASS PITCHES TODAY**

Cuts in local authority funding have led to a decline in the quality of grass pitches in England.

Grassroots football clubs tell us that pitches are their biggest issue.









## THE GRASS PITCH REVOLUTION

## We are going to change this through a grass pitch revolution.

- Unprecedented investment in grass pitches by the Premier League, The FA, and the Government through their charity, the Football Foundation
- New performance standard for monitoring football pitch quality
- Ambition to have 5,000 'good' pitches by 2024, as part of the overall aim to have 20,000 quality grass pitches up and down the country over the next 10 years



## JOIN OUR GRASS PITCH REVOLUTION

#### WHAT IS AVAILABLE?

- A 10 year maintenance plan to improve your pitches
- A 6 year grant, providing up to £2,500 inc. VAT for every one of your 11-a-side pitches in the first two years and tapered down over six years (£2,000 for 9-a-side and £1,500 for Mini Soccer pitches)
- Grants available to employ contractors, purchase materials and purchase a soil sampler
  - Separate grants available for pitch maintenance equipment and machinery
- Maintenance plan based on the recommendations in your PitchPower Assessment Report
- Grants are to improve grassroots community pitches. Pitches used for Step 1 6 are ineligible. Pitches in the Regional Feeder League (previously Step 7) may be eligible as long as the predominant usage is for grassroots community teams






#### WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE FUNDING?

- Improve and sustain the quality of grass football pitches
- The Grounds Management Association (GMA) has created a new standard for grass pitches
- To bring a minimum of 20,000 pitches up to a "Good" standard

Your PitchPower Assessment Report will tell you what level your pitches are at.



NB. Other standards exist for higher levels of the game.



#### WHAT SUPPORT WILL IT HELP PAY FOR?

You can receive a grant to pay for a **pitch maintenance contractor** to help you improve your grass pitches with enhanced maintenance work.



A 10 year maintenance plan determined by the GMA within your PitchPower Assessment Report



The Football Foundation will award 67% of the total cost for the first 6 years of your maintenance plan





## **PITCHPOWER**

## **PITCHPOWER**

- Allows you to input pitch information yourself
- Significantly reduces the time it takes to receive the report compared with site visits
- Provides ongoing advice about how to improve your pitch
- Works via a combination of photographs (site condition and soil sample) and information input
- Free to download and use

- Please ensure you use **PitchPower** on all pitches you want funding for/you maintain









## **PITCHPOWER**





#### **PITCHPOWER - THE REPORT**

- You'll need to submit your completed inspection before you can apply for any funding from the Football Foundation
- The GMA will review the information and assess the quality of your pitches
- You'll receive an assessment report from your Regional Pitch Advisor within 21 days of submitting your inspection
- The report will provide practical recommendations of how you can improve the quality of your grass pitches
- Reports are your gateway to funding




#### Our recommendations In addition to your current maintenance practices we recommend the following additional interventions or changes to existing specification(s) Carry this out week The pitches should be maintained at a height between 30-35mm during the growing season and increased to between 35,40mm during the Autumn and Winter months. There are exceptions to this, during drought periods height of cut should be increased to reduce stress on the plant and cutting avoided all together if growth has ceased. A height of cut between 35-40mm during close season will aid establishment of new prowth and reduce the impact of stress factors such as drought or disease. Frequency of cutting should be weekly as a minimum. Increas mowing frequency to once per week in growing season to avoid issues with grass being too long and debris left after cutting. Application of fertilise Carry this out 2x a week by a suitable materials provider on an annual basis following this applications of a suitable controlled/slow release fertiliser should be made, 2 applications per season would be the minimum recommended. on the 9v9 pitch and 3-4 on the stadia pitch given the standard of football played. Some fertilisers offer 5-6months longevity and these would be ideal for bi-annual application and will avoid the flushes of growth that are causing the club problems with debris and long grass. Application of selective herbicide (weed treatment) Carry this out once a year selective herbicide during the growing season when the weeds are actively growing. This must be applied by a qualified professional with appropriate spraying licenses. The weed population is extremely high and careful consideration will need to be given to when weed control takes take care to use a product that will not affect the sowing of new seed if over seeding has taken place alternatively application will have to be 6-8 weeks prior to or after seeding. Ideally because of the extensive weed cover if they could be treated in early spring with scarification and over seeding to follow 6-8 weeks hence that may be the best solution. It can be effective to mix a small amount of liquid fertiliser in with the selective herbicide to aid penetration into the weeds and aid grass recovery.



## CONNECTING THROUGH THE APP – RENOVATION GUIDANCE (SUMMER 2021)

- Traditional May Early June renovation will be affected
- Flexibility will be key. There may only be a short period (if any) between end of the 20/21 season and the start of the 21/22 season
- This doesn't mean operations can't take place. You can find guidance on an alternative renovation programme
  - Careful consideration should be given to going ahead with capital projects such as drainage

## Renovation Guidance (Summer 2021)

Part 2 of the 2 part series:

4. Support & Funding

With the announcement of the extension of the football season, the traditional May - early June full renovation will be affected. This does not mean operations cannot take place but the key will be flexibility. There may be only a short period between the end of the 20/21 season and the start of the 21/22 season, 4 to 6 weeks. Weather and recovery time will be against you.

Careful consideration will also have to be given to capital works with the extension of the season will there be enough recovery and time of establishment before the new season.









